

GRUPO AEROPORTUARIO DEL PACIFICO REPORTS PASSENGER TRAFFIC DECREASE OF 11.8% FOR JULY 2009

Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico – August 5, 2009 - Grupo Aeroportuario del Pacifico, S.A.B. de C.V. (NYSE: PAC; BMV: GAP) (“the Company” or “GAP”) announced today preliminary terminal passenger traffic figures for the month of July 2009 compared to traffic figures for July 2008.

During July 2009, **total terminal passengers** decreased 11.8% compared to the previous year; domestic passenger traffic decreased 9.5%, while international passenger traffic decreased 16.6% compared to July 2008.

Regarding material events for the month of July, Aeromexico initiated operations to operate the Guadalajara – Los Mochis - Tijuana route and Interjet initiated operations to operate the Guadalajara – Cancun route, which the Company expects will aid in the recovery of traffic at GAP's airports.
